FLOODS KILL HUNDREDS IN EAST AFRICA

Flooding as a result of recent heavy rains has killed more than 750 people across East Africa. Kenya has been the hardest hit with the government recording 837 deaths.

In the Congo DMZ, 205 people have died and floods have killed hundreds in the Ethiomalian Territories. In Sheeba, high water levels have trapped an estimated 300 patients inside a hospital.

The authorities in Kenya have told people in some of the affected areas to move away from "potential danger". The water has also washed away 80,000 acres of crops and some vital infrastructure, the government has said. Operations at the Kilimanjaro Mass Driver have not been impacted, though getting cargo to the facility has been made more challenging.



Meteorologists predict that the heavier than usual rains will continue throughout May, reports the BBC's Patience Atuhaire in Nairobi. The rainy season normally lasts until June, so additional flooding is expected.
